Evolution of the California Community Colleges Economic and Workforce Programs

Since 2004 the SCBC has participated in the California community college mission to ensure a trained workforce for the life sciences industry. In 2012, the California legislature passed two major bills that will fund the programs going forward.

SB 1402 reauthorizes the California Economic and Workforce programs. It adds accountability measures and reinforces the sector strategy objective, naming life sciences one of the priority strategies.

SB 1070 focuses on strengthening Career Technical Education Pathways

This reauthorization provides us the opportunity to continue to participate in creating the skilled workforce needed by the life sciences industry.

To do this, the SCBC is looking at the new streams of funding that are coming in the "Doing What Matters" framework (<http://doingwhatmatters.cccco.edu>)

The strategy of this framework is four-pronged:

Give Priority for jobs and the economy

Make Room for jobs and the economy

Promote **Student Success**

Innovate for jobs and the economy
